Collaboration in IAS management

1. Suggest a collaboration for IAS control on sites that are on several land owners' properties



For IAS control sites that are located on several owners' lands, it is essential to collaborate in eradicating the growth and monitoring the control.

This helps ensure sustainable outcomes and diminishing the risk of spread due to control measures.

Do this

Find out if the area has any control target sites that extend to properties owned by others in addition to the municipality.

Contact the owner and suggest collaboration to eradicate the invasive alien species.

If possible, offer case-bycase assistance in combating IAS to e.g. elderly citizens.

Benefits of the action

An agreed collaboration ensures successful IAS control on target sites of importance, such as growths on the banks of flowing waters that make for efficient spreading pathways.
